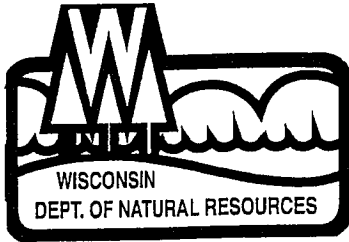

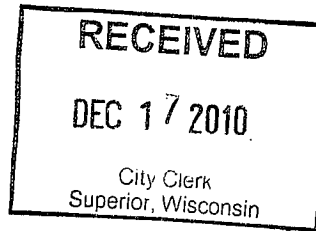

RE: Notice that the Department has an application from Loons Foot Marina LLC to construct a marina on the old Northern Pacific Ore Dock which requires a submerged land lease.

The Department of Natural Resources has received an application to construct a marina and boat repair facility at the Old Northern Pacific Railroad Ore Dock next to Loons Foot Landing in the City of Superior. The Structure is located in the Northwest ¼, of Section 29, Township 49 North, Range 13 West. Loons Foot Marina has published a notice of complete application to dredge less than 3000 cubic yards of sediment to construct a boat lift, construct retaining walls and a lift will, to grade more than 10,000 sq. feet on the banks of the St. Louis River and to place piers. The Department has determined that to legally permit the use of filled lands for a private aid to navigation requires a submerged lease. As such the Department will issue a Bulkhead line permit to coincide with the submerged land lease.

This letter is being sent as required by s. 30.11(5), Wis. Statutes at least 30 day prior to making a determination that the physical changes to the structure on the bed of the river are consistent with the public's interest. The Department has reviewed the application and other information. The change in use requires the applicant to obtain a lease from the Board of Commission of Public Lands.

b. Approval of firefighter hire timeline, HR Administrator Koneczny explained the process that we will participate in with Chippewa Valley Technical College. The oral process testing date will be decided at a later time. HR Administrator Koneczny recommended approving this timeline, with the condition that nothing changes tomorrow at a meeting at Chippewa Valley Technical College that Chief Rigstad will attend.

*MOTION by Commissioner Dalbec, seconded by Commissioner Nordness and carried to approve the Firefighter entry level testing timeline.*

c. Chief Peters gave commissioners invitations to our annual awards ceremony to be held on Friday, January 14<sup>th</sup>, 2011. The department will swear in three new officers, recognize one promotion, and honor officers for outstanding achievements. Chief Peters told the members some background on the three new officers, Jennifer Orn, Eric Olson, and Sean Holmgren. Sean Holmgren is still in the pre-hire requirement portion of hiring status. Jennifer Orn and Eric Olson's hire dates are 8/23/10 and they recently graduated from Basic Recruit School and will begin the Field Training Program. Sean Holmgren, after passing all of the pre-hire requirements, will have a hire date of 1/10/11. All three officers are required to successfully complete a one year probationary period. Chief Peters talked about our federal COPS grant that the department recently received. This grant will fully fund an officer's position, (salary and benefits) \$262,000, for three years. Part of the grant requirements are for the department to create a new position to focus on community policing, Chief Peters noted that our department was one of five departments in the state of Wisconsin to receive this grant. City Council has approved us accepting the grant. The department will be at full capacity again.

a. Fire promotional probationary period denied. President Nordness gave a brief overview of the situation for firefighter employee Joe Roberts.

*MOTION by Commissioner Dalbec, seconded by Commissioner Glazman, and carried to approve Chief Rigstad's action to deny promotional probationary period.*

d. Letter from Attorney Cunningham on behalf of Joseph Roberts, requesting a PFC hearing for Chief Rigstad's denial of firefighter Roberts' promotional probationary period. Attorney Cunningham gave his view of this situation and disagreed with the commissioners' decision. Attorney Cunningham made a number of arguments orally concerning the fire chief's actions during firefighter Roberts' probationary period. City Attorney Frog Prell clarified some items that were being discussed, and said that the commission had acted appropriately and within their power. City Attorney Prell also clarified what the rules are regarding a probationary status, and advised that the committee had acted appropriately.

1. Held in committee from 9-16-09: Concerns regarding train horns. The City is working with the DOT to finish some closures from a couple years ago. It was suggested that Councilors Bridge and Olson attend the next meeting, as they requested this item be placed back on the agenda for further information on their concerns.

2. Request from Councilors Olson and Bender for review of the Banks Avenue project, Phase 2 for 2011. This item was discussed at the last council meeting.

**MOTION by Mick MacKenzie, seconded by Chuck Hendry, and carried to receive and file.**

3. Request from Councilor Olson for installation of a street light on the S curve on 58th Street by the Nemadji Golf Course. It was unsure what the concern was, as Councilor Olson was not present. Mick MacKenzie said he had talked to Councilor Olson who said this is a dark area and the curve has been recently changed and a sidewalk added. Terri Kalan agreed this area is dark and cars do travel fast; she said the beginning of the S curve is not lit. A light could be placed near the entrance to the golf course, and Jeff Goetzman said the area could be looked at and this item reported on for the next meeting.

**MOTION by Chuck Hendry, seconded by Mick MacKenzie, and carried to hold in committee.**

4. Request from Councilor McDonald for review of diagonal parking on both sides of 14th Avenue East between East 5th and 6th Streets. Councilor McDonald reported that a resident, Betty Burns, does not want/like the stripes painted on her side of the street, (there are only two houses on this side of the street). It was suggested that when the lines wear off, they should not be repainted on that side of the street, and Jeff Goetzman said that the time until the next repainting could be extended.

**MOTION by Mick MacKenzie, seconded by Chuck Hendry, and carried to receive and file.**

5. Request from Councilor Finsland for "No Parking Between Signs" on Catlin Avenue (Erlenbach Way) at the crosswalk at 19th Street (signs to be placed about 20 feet south of the crosswalk and just north of the crosswalk on the east side of Catlin Avenue). Councilor Finsland said this was suggested by Tom Fennessey from UWS for pedestrian safety—when large vehicles park near this crosswalk, pedestrians cannot be seen. This would eliminate one parking spot on Catlin Avenue near the athletic center on 19th Street.

**MOTION by Chuck Hendry, seconded by Mick MacKenzie, and carried to approve the placement of signage for "No Parking Between Signs" on Catlin Avenue at the crosswalk at 19th Street.**
